

Funding Breakdown

- Available for round 2 \$4.6 million
- Job Creating Projects \$3.6 million
- Community Enhancing Projects \$1 million
- Continuing to honor the work in Regional Plan Part II, while continuing to move towards the State's Economic Blueprint
- Jobs First webpage

Job Creating Projects (\$3.6 Million)

- Primary goal of business development and growth that then create good paying jobs in the region. Projects supporting the industries of tourism and outdoor recreation, medtech, high- tech hardware, semiconductors & microelectronics, advanced manufacturing, precision manufacturing, healthcare, childcare, education, aerospace and defense, hydrogen, and construction.
- Project must show that there is a significant benefit to Orange County's disinvested communities.
- Workforce development projects must be in connection with a future economic development project or some commitment to partner from an employer(s).
- Stronger projects also demonstrate a positive impact on the climate.

Community Enhancing Projects (\$1,000,000)

- Address any topic(s) in the Regional Plan Part 2, and/or industries not mentioned in the Job Creating Projects section, and/or could not meet the definition of a good paying job/income.
- Although not exhaustive, these would be topics such as housing, healthcare access, green technologies, childcare and climate adaptation.
- For projects that are not primarily climate focused, stronger projects demonstrate a positive impact on the climate.
- Collaborative decides how this funding gets spent.

Scoring Criteria

- Project Impact (30 points)
- Economic Equity/Equity (30 points)
- Work Plan (20 points) Focus on the <u>Pre-Development Activities</u>
- Organizational Qualifications (10 points)
- Proposed Budget and Budget Narrative (10 points)
- Must provide one letter of reference

- Reminder: Conflict of Interest Statement is found on page 26 of the NOFO packet

Predevelopment Project Phases:

- Catalyst Predevelopment Phase Projects will fall into one of three stages: Concept, Accelerate, or Last Mile. There is not a requirement to fund a minimum number of projects in each stage but is used as tool to compare projects that are in the same stage.
 - 1. Concept: Recommend not to request over \$50,000 Grant
 - Accelerator: Recommend not to request over \$250,000
 - 3.Last Mile: Recommend not to request over \$750,000
- All activities must be fully expensed by September 30, 2026.

Selection Process

- All applications will be accessible to collaborative members
- Applications will be reasonably anonymized
- Triaged by Job Creating or Community Enhancing
- Triaged again by Concept, Accelerate, and Last Mile. No funding guarantees, just for apples to apples comparisons.

Selection Process

• Community Enhancing Projects:

- Collaborative will review and score all projects based on the criteria listed above and award activities until all funds are exhausted.
- Optional Virtual Community Enhancing Project Selection Briefing July 11, 2025
- Online Poll to vote on projects
- Approximate award notifications July 25, 2025
- Job Creating Projects:
 - Regional Convener team will propose a list of projects to Collaborative for funding prior to July 18th meeting
 - Collaborative will have opportunity to affirm choices and/or recommend alternatives.
 - Regional Convener team will decide if any modifications to the original selections need to be made

Applications and Funding Timeline

- Applications are due no later than 5:00 PM Pacific Time on Friday, June 20, 2025, and must be submitted through the designated grant web portal. Applicants must create an account in the portal to begin their application. Please carefully follow all instructions provided in the portal. The link to the portal can be found <u>here</u>.





Overview of Awardees and Contracting Process





In this partnership, Charitable Ventures:

- Executes and manages contracts with awardees,
- Reviews invoices and process payments, and
- Provides ongoing support throughout the subcontract term

Contracting Process

○W-9 & SoS status

 Review materials from awardees and confirm compliance with legal and financial requirements

○ SOW- budget

Insurance
Procurement justification

- Send contract draft— negotiate or clarify terms, if needed
- Route contract for signature internally and with the awardee

This process takes anywhere from 4-8 weeks to complete



Current Status & Upcoming Milestones

Current Statuses

- Announcement of awardees share 04/11 and contracting process started soon after
- Of the 14 awarded proposals, 14 are eligible for funding and have been contacted to complete the contracting process
- <u>ALL</u> contracts have been sent out for execution

Contract effective dates are either 05/01 or 06/01



Upcoming Milestones

Awardees can start billing as early as the effective date of their contract and effective dates are based on the date that all required documents are reviewed and approved by OCBC and/or CV (1st of the month)

We are happy to be able to offer Advanced Payment of up to 25% of the proposed award





Advanced Payment

- Advanced payments are meant to support awardees for early project activities
- The use of the funds is flexible
- Up to 25% of the awarded amount may be requested
- 2 documents need to be completed for consideration/approval: Statement of Need & Timeline of Spend
- Turnaround time is 1-2 weeks from submission to be considered for approval then 2-3 weeks for payment



Themes & Challenges

Themes & Challenges

- There was slowdown from the State on approving proposals/funding
- There was confusion with the SOW
 - Moving forward, awardees do not need to complete it— the workplan from the proposal will be in the SOW.
 - If there needs to be changes in the work, OCBC will receive and process change orders
 - If there needs to be changes in the budget, CV will receive and process any budget mods (greater than 10% of total shift)



Our goal is to get the awardees contracted and ready to do work as soon as possible
